

About Daboya

Daboya is the capital of the North Gonja district, located in the Savannah Region of Northern Ghana. Positioned approximately two hours away from Tamale, the economic capital of Northern Ghana, Daboya is renowned for its historic trade in salt and vibrant naturally dyed textile industry.

About the Museum of Natural and Cultural Heritage

The Museum of Natural and Cultural Heritage is located within the Shai Hills Resource Reserve, in the Shai - Osudoku District, Greater - Accra Region. Also known as The Museum at Shai Hills, the facility became operational on March 3, 2020. The Museum has a gallery, library, seminar room, laboratory, and large compound. These components of the Museum promote research, community engagement, community development, conservation education, heritage education, environmental studies, biodiversity conservation, recreation, and eco-and-heritage tourism. The museum receives Ghanaian and foreign visitors who visit the park or the local community. The site is also used as a training ground for the Department of Archaeology and Heritage Studies and Department of Animal Biology and Conservation Science at the University of Ghana.
