LEARNING WITH MEMORY: A TEACHER TRAINING TOOLKIT (TTT)


Our aim is to encourage students and teachers in Myanmar to explore place-based learning methods through local communities? participation drawing upon their own histories and experience, especially in conditions of political instability and cultural fragility. We are co-developing a bilingual (English and Myanmar) Teacher Training Toolkit (TTT) using storytelling and remembering as critical pedagogical tools.

HOW

- A group of international educators from HAB network and beyond have been collaborating in a series of online and onsite training workshops for teachers in Myanmar.
- The group is developing place-based education materials co-created by learners whose spaces of education have been threatened by conflict, disaster, or other vulnerabilities.

WHY
